with a Gift to BAM/PFA



Professor Emeritus James Cahill (1926–2014) taught Chinese art history at UC Berkeley for twenty-nine years. He communicated the history and theory of Chinese painting in such a dynamic fashion that his classes and seminars were always packed with students, auditors, docents, and collectors. The true magic of studying at Berkeley emerged, however, when he arranged for the class to view paintings at BAM/PFA, many of which he had donated from his own collection. Cahill used the collection to engage students in dialogue about brushwork, connoisseurship, authenticity, and condition, and looking intently at real works of art.



A specialized study and storage area for the University of California, Berkeley Art Museum and Pacific Film Archive's collection of historical Asian artworks, including its renowned Chinese paintings, will be a significant feature of BAM/PFA's new building in downtown Berkeley, scheduled to open to the public in early 2016. The Asian art study center, outfitted with customized, archival storage spaces and furnishings, will help BAM/PFA care for these important works and make them more accessible to researchers, students, and visitors. Our goal is raise \$1 million to name this study center after UC Berkeley Professor Emeritus James Cahill, reflecting the invaluable contributions he made to both the University and BAM/PFA.




高居翰

善捐籌建 BAM/PFA 亞洲藝術研究中心



被譽為卓越的東亞藝術史家、杰出的教師、作家、以及中國和日本的非凡鑒賞家的高居翰教授 (1926-2014) 在美國加州大學柏克萊分校 (UC Berkeley) 任教中國藝術史長達29年。他那獨特活躍的講學方式,歷年來吸引了無數在讀學生、旁聽生、博物館導賞員和收藏家們的參與學習和討論;其課堂及研討班往往坐無虛席。高教授生前給他的學生創造了無以倫比的學習條件:除課堂以外,他安排學生到柏克萊加大博物館與太平洋電影資料庫BAM/PFA 觀摹藏品,其中有許多畫作均來自他的私人捐贈。通過仔細觀看實物,高教授引導學生從中識別筆墨與真偽、學習鑒賞和瞭解作品的保存情況。
